oversaw the project, as well as Board Members Jill Raine, Sam Pollock, Ron Bilyk and Peggy Beaver. Ross Hillis, representing the Foundation Board, was also in attendance, and we were thrilled that he was able to join us, given that the Foundation supported this project in a major way.

A big thank you to the 60+ donors who together raised \$60,000.00! This project would not have been possible without your generous support!

New Dining Rooms A HIT WITH RESIDENTS

The residents on the 5th and 6th floors are very happy with their new dining space. Zeus Melendrez, Charge Nurse 6th Floor, says that the warm, welcoming environment certainly contributes to a pleasurable dining experience for the residents. The residents are



happy not having to wait for the elevator six times a day and it gives them more time to be on the unit or involved in activities. Victoria Melocoton, Charge Nurse, 5th Floor, says that the residents love the new flat-panel TV and are enjoying watching Netflix!

Staff have also said that the unitbased dining room gives them more time to provide care to the residents and meal times are not so rushed. More staff are now available to assist the residents with meals as they are no longer on 'elevator duty'. You will see the Activation Staff assisting in the dining rooms on a daily basis.

So what's the next project for the home? We have three projects planned for 2015. These are replacement of the

emergency generator, the installation of more security cameras

and the installation of an elevator lock-out system on each of the three elevators. This means that if a resident who is wearing a Wanderguard bracelet enters the elevator, it will not move until a staff member enters a code. This will improve resident safety as it is another level of protection for those residents who are at risk of wandering off the unit or out of the building. You will be hearing more about these initiatives over the next few months.
