
were thrilled to receive our two pictures, so as we were heading to Ottawa for the conference, we took them with us on the plane. The conference photographer took a group picture for us.

The first photo is a 4 foot panoramic shot of the 124th Battalion and is dated Toronto 1916. As you can see, the picture is in very good condition.

The second photo is actually a needlepoint picture of

the Dominion of Canada flag along with the flags of the Allied forces.

We were thrilled to be able to donate these pictures and I am sure that the resident would be happy with my decision to display them in a location that will be visible to many visitors from around the world! These photos were obviously very special to him and now they are in a place of honour, worthy of their status as historical artifacts.



IN MAY 2014 at a Professional Advisory Committee meeting the multidisciplinary team determined the need to improve the outcomes of Diabetes Management in the residents at The Wexford. With this purpose in mind, a team of specialists in Diabetes Care (Endocrinologist Dr. Afshan Zahedi and Pharmacist Freda Leung) were invited to provide guidance and education for staff and families.

A working group of health care professionals were given the task to gather and analyze existing guidelines and other materials and to prepare health care documentation that would reflect the best practices in Diabetes Management for the elderly. In addition to this, four staff members, Pharmacist Lynne Anderson, Nurse

Manager Iryna Zhuk, RPNs Raina Varghese and Victoria Melocoton, attended a course at Michener Institute where they obtained certification in Management of Diabetes in the Elderly.

This project has given the staff, residents and family members a better understanding and knowledge of diabetes management and complications in the elderly. An increased awareness and recognition of hypoglycemia and hyperglycemia, helps to decrease hospital emergency visits.

We have also revised the Nursing policy and procedures to incorporate the following:

- Sick Day Protocol (including a SICKMAN medication list)
- Started Manual Monthly Blood

Glucose Logs with pattern management

- Monthly reviews with doctors and Charge Nurses
- Blood Glucose logs
- Discontinued the use of Sliding Scale
- Started to adjust insulin based on Blood Glucose values
- Developed a Hypoglycemia Treatment Kit and an individualized Glucagon kit for each floor.

With these new best practices in place, we can better manage the incidents of diabetes complications in our residents. Here at The Wexford, we are always looking for new ways to equip ourselves to ensure that our residents enjoy "healthy living" in a caring and safe community.

Presenting to the Scarborough Community of Practice.


THE WEXFORD BEHAVIOUR TEAM was invited to present at the Fall Scarborough Community of Practice put on by Central East Community Care Access Centre.

EXCELLENCE in Resident Centred Care (ERCC) is an innovative education program developed by RIA and Conestoga College. The program is supported in part by funding from the Government of Ontario to the Schlegel Centre for Learning Research and Innovation in Long-Term Care (CLRI) and received the Ontario Long Term Care Association's Quality Improvement Award.

The aim of the program is to enhance Personal Support Workers. (PSW's) skills and knowledge using a resident-centered approach.

Conestoga College offers this course in two parts; the first is a "train-the-trainer" course where individuals become certified to train other PSW's within their organization. The second course, led by the certified trainer, engages PSW's to enhance their skills and provide excellent, resident-centred care that makes a difference.

The 3 PSW's from the Wexford, Abonesh Girma-Damene, Anna Kupisz and Lyra Lazaga along with the Nurse Manager Fida Alkhatib successfully completed the course components this year and received a course certificate and are qualified to train their peers. This means that they will be prepared to facilitate the onsite delivery of ERCC for PSWs course training at The Wexford.

The New Bath/Spa at the Wexford

WE ARE PLEASED to announce the opening of our new Bath/Spa program. This program is done in conjunction with Nursing and Life Enrichment/ Complementary Care. The Technical support and training required to operate the baths was provided by Arjo a well-known bath company. Presently the program runs once a week on Mondays, however as the needs increase we will be evaluating to see if we can add another day.



Residents who would benefit from the program are identified and a bath/spa profile for each resident is completed. The profile lets the staff know their interests and preferences, such as the temperature of the water, if they want to have their hair done, type of shampoo they like, if they would like to have their nails done, as well as the type of cream they would like to have. The resident's family members are kept informed of their response to the program.

The Bath/Spa will contribute to the health and well being of our residents. Water therapy is part of

the program and it will help to ease chronic pain and discomfort. A comfy chair, warm towels, the music of their choice and candle light helps to create a relaxing and comforting atmosphere.



The Spa has been a great experience for the residents who take part on a weekly basis. The responses have been very positive. They enjoy the pampering, feel very relaxed, and always have great conversations during the session.
